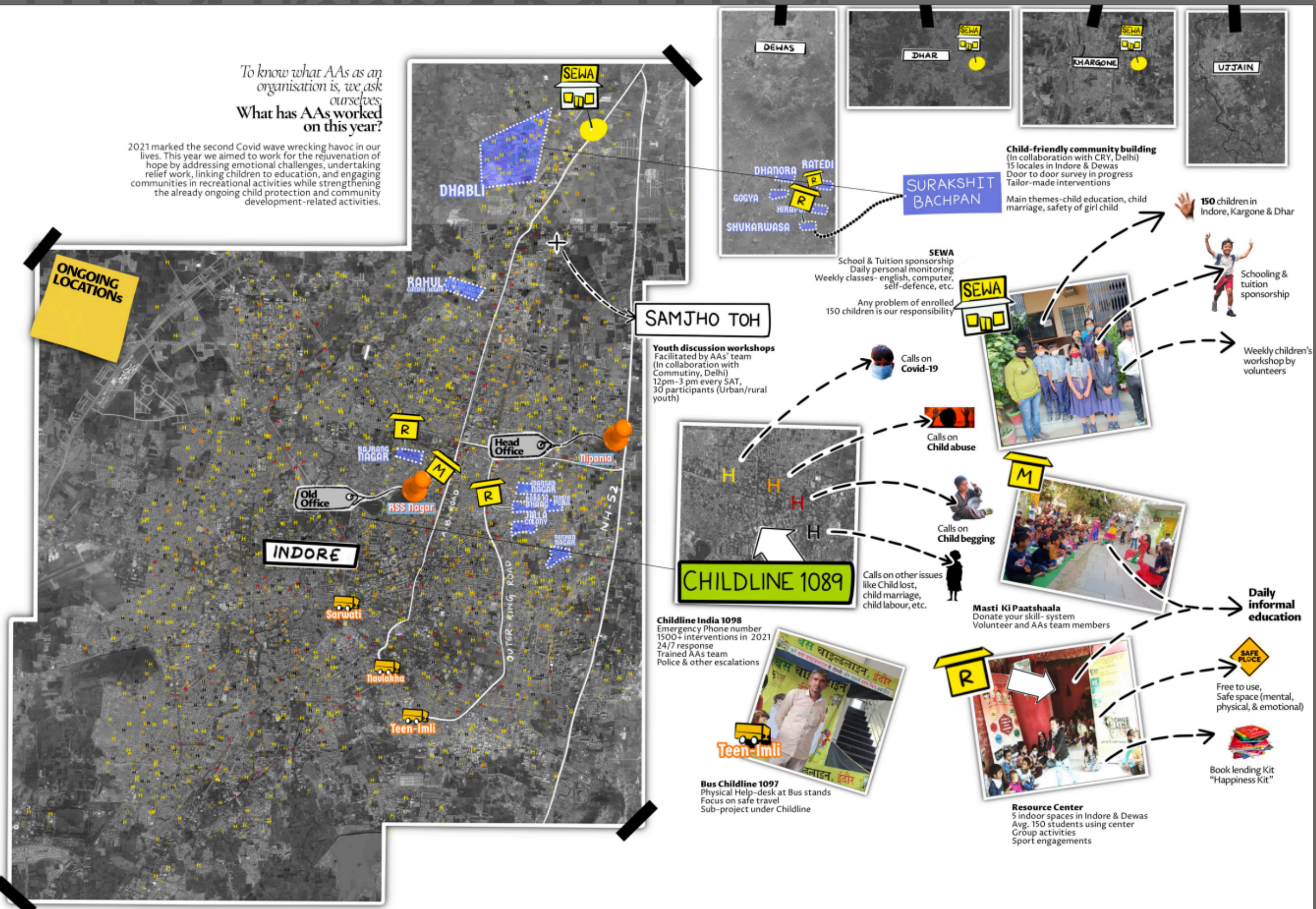
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To know what AAs as an organisation is, we ask ourselves: What has AAs worked on this year?

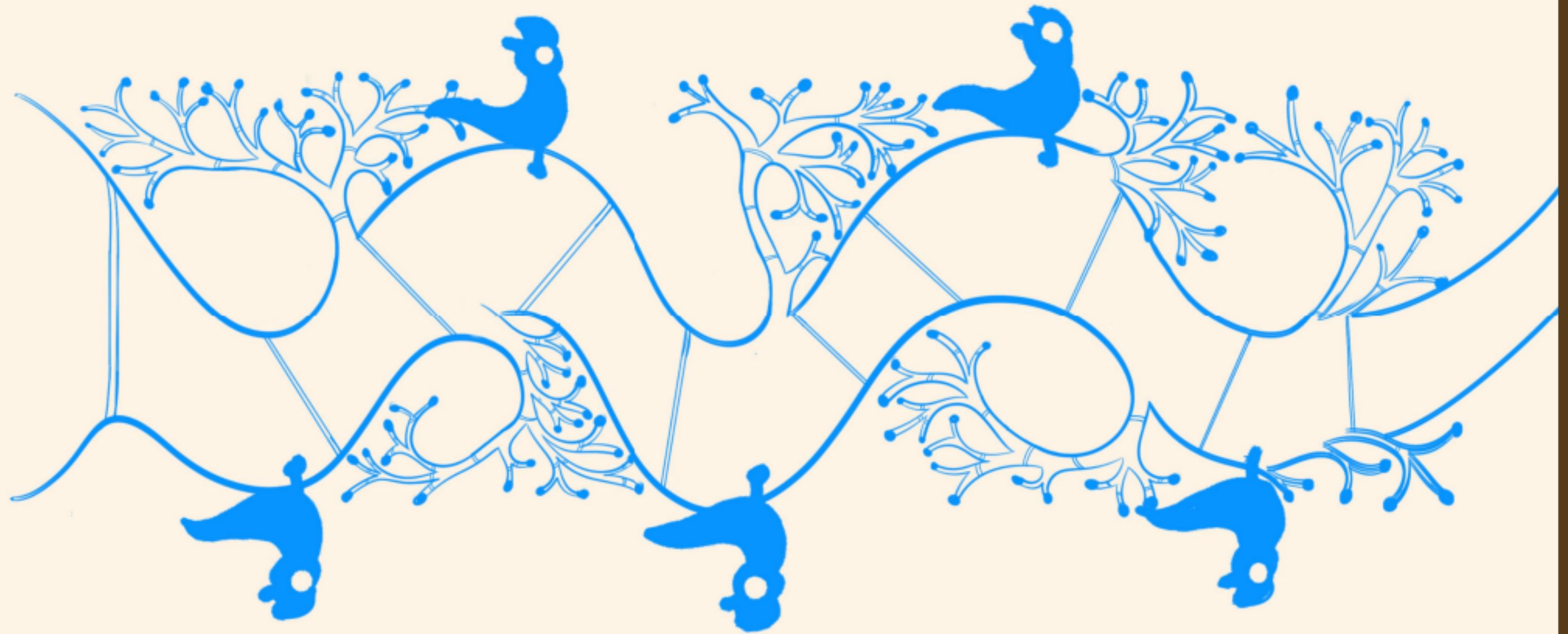
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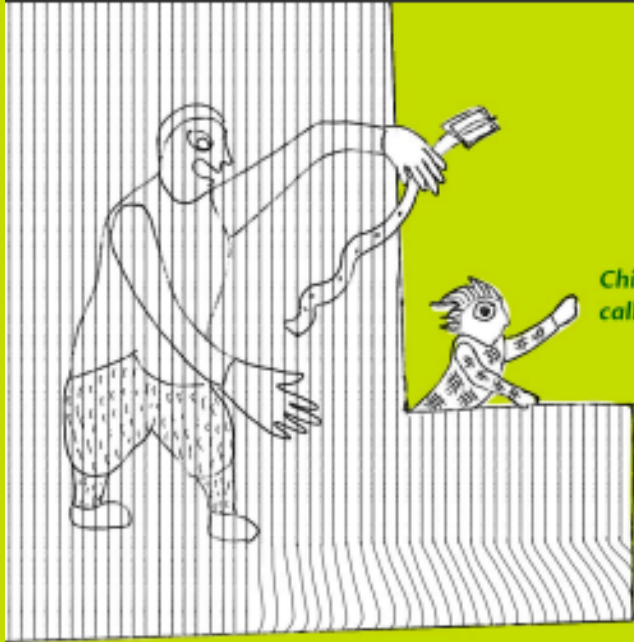
We, seven founding members of the organisation joined the same college to pursue M.A. in Social work.

If child needs physical assistance...

CHILDLINE, 1098 is a phone number that creates hope for millions of children across India. It is a 24-hour a day, 365 days a year, free, emergency phone service for children in need of aid and assistance.

Some of the cases that Aas has taken up through the city ChildLine include **child labour, child marriage, children whose families are in crisis, children in need of medical help etc.** AAs supported more than 10000 children in of need care and protection in the last ten year of the implementation of the CHILDLINE Project.



Childline Awareness:

Every fortnight, AAs conducts a Childline awareness called "Open House." Each session we bring together a new group of underprivileged children and try to address their problems in daily life that could be intervened through Childline. We give them a basic understanding on certain issues like Good touch Bad touch, Child Marriage, etc. so that they know when is the right time to call Childline.

In some Open sessions, we also talk to other stakeholders such as parents, teachers, police officials, court officials, etc. so that we can chart out a plan together.

Childline Se Dosti week (14-21 Nov) is condensed public awareness campaign on Childline. We had multiple sessions on the use of childline with police officials, social workers, schools, and respected MLA Aakash Vijayvargiya. The week ended with a cycle rally by children supported by AAs.

BUS Childline:

CHILDLINE Foundation in partnership with AAs has set up help-desks in 3 major Indore bus stands. A separate bus initiative was proposed given the number of children who run away or go missing or are trafficked for child labour through buses. With this initiative, people can immediately and directly approach these help desks.



Rescue:

In case of emergencies AAs would physically be present either themselves or through police in under 60 minutes.

Call a friend:

Connecting the case to other stakeholders like Police stations, counsellors, child's protection boards, etc.



Long-term:

We look for long term solutions for the child. We consider options of placing them in children homes.



Childline transfers the call to a local intervention partner like AAS.

This year CHILDLINE service was actively functioning during the entire period of lockdown and more than 1551 cases were intervened.

This year AAs also intensively worked to address Child Marriage issues in Indore.

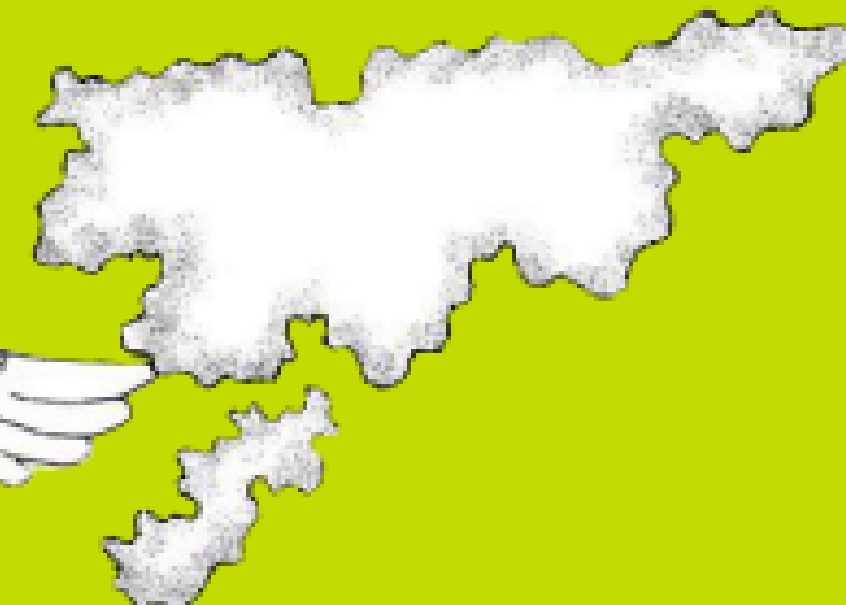
It was quite surprising that when the entire country facing this COVID-19 pandemic, some people were trying for child marriages for their children. AAs with the support of the women and child development department, Indore stopped 27 child marriages in Indore.

“I and my mum live alone. She is a kind and sweet person but recently after some family problems, she suddenly changed. She was irritated and scolded me often. One-time mum started to slap me when I didn't finish my homework. I close my eyes and screamed; I cried for an hour. Suddenly, an aunty knocked at our door, and told us she is from childline and someone called her after hearing me scream. There was also a Police uncle and he talked to my mom. They asked me if I felt safe with my mum. I told them that she was actually a sweet person and that she would stop hitting me from now on. They give me a number which I can call whenever I felt scared. They talked a lot with my mum, and said this was a warning. Later my mom apologized to me and she said she would never hit me again. I feel very happy to have my old mom.”

“One evening my younger daughter didn't return home after school. I dialed the Childline and they connected me to madam. She helped me in registering the case at the police station with the necessary documents and gave me a phone number of an investigation officer. I told them I suspected my daughter ran away with a boy she met on a social media website. They connected me with a Cyber cell and with police help I was able to track down my daughter's location. Then the police brought back my daughter. The chatline officer gave counseling to my daughter and told me to be friendly with her so that she can be open with me. I thanked the Childline officer and AAs team for helping me in this tough time”

“I used to live with my parents. A few months ago, my father passed away and my mum started to behave violently with me. That is when I and my grandmother ran away to Vijayanagar junction. We used to get some money from begging, but it was not enough as I also started having fits and grandma didn't have hospital money. Someone told my grandmother to dial 1098 on her phone and the person on the phone sent a didi to us. After talking to grandma, she took me to a new place to stay called Rajkiya Bal Sanrakshan Ashram, and there I really liked the food. I also made new friends and I told my grandmother that I wanted to stay here forever. My grandmother talked to didi and she said I can be there forever. Didi also took me to a hospital to get a medical checkup done.

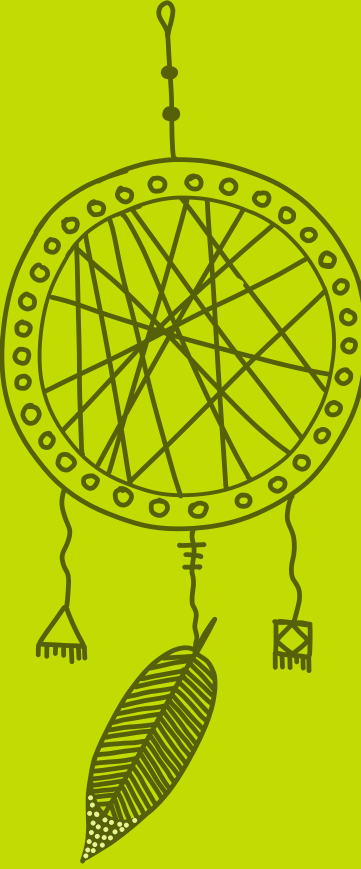

A national programme designed by vartaLeap, Com Mutiny- The Youth Collective, and Pravah, in 2015 that brings together young people from varied identities and ideologies to deeply dialogue, collaborate upon, and co-create a shared idea of India. The creators of this programme were responding to the increasing polarization in public dialogue, wherein we cannot discuss anything these days.



TIME TO MEND OUR DIVISIONS

Com Mutiny has partnered with 25 organisations across 15 states in India to bring this programme to more than 1200 young people. Since one year, AAs has started to conduct this programme under the guidance of the creators.

Each programme begins with an open call in schools and colleges. We then curate the group with a variety of opposing opinions so that the discussions are fruitful. The programme is 6 weeks long with 3-4 hours participation every week.

Adda 0: Orientation Introductions, context setting, ground rules
Adda 1 and 2: How my mind got set? Expressing View Points & Appreciative Enquiry
Adda 3 & 4: Dialogue and Collaboration Dialogue Charter & Shared vision of India
Adda 5 & 6: Art making Co-creating an artistic expression (eg.song) Celebration and Recognition

Coming from an underserved community, Himanshi has faced financial issues which made it difficult for her to afford school education. But, her dreams were larger than her hardships. Her mother had planned her marriage at the very young age but as she got connected with SEWA, her studies were resumed and she has completed her schooling and now she is pursuing B.Sc in Computer Science from ISBA Institute of Professional Studies. Meanwhile, she has also been enrolled in Aviation, Hospitality, Travel & Tourism Management, Customer Service & Tourism from AKSA institute.

SEWA

In the seven years of SEWA project, the AAs team and the children have developed a family-like bond. The children openly share about their feelings and struggles. And our team modifies and adjusts the program to them.



What does a SEWA project member do?

SCHOOL VISITS

Through the SEWA project children get financial support for schooling and college. SEWA team does a weekly visit to screen children's academic activities. Some common scenarios during visit are:

- A child has dropped out of school because of negative influence of drugs in the neighbourhood. Team counsels child and his mother. Team convinces the child to rejoin school and his mother to bring him for counselling sessions.
- A child says that his school fees are due. The team escalates child's reports to higher ups to get the funding to get the fees paid.
- A little girl and her mom report to team that they need financial assistance to get school supplies before the new class starts. So, they correspond with school to get uniform and textbooks for the new year.



SUNDAY MEET-UPS

Team hosts Sunday meet-ups wherein yoga class, arts & crafts activities, and special vocational training are conducted on followed by breakfast. Some activities are also conducted by volunteers.

Topical issues like Covid Awareness and General knowledge classes are taken.



RATION

Team distributes Food supplies. Possible scenario:
The raw-ration kits are brought at the local aanganawadi centre. Team member checks off his list while distributed the 15 kg wheat bag to the SEWA enrolled children one by one.



HANG-OUT WITH KIDS

Team tries to be a friend to the children as much as a mentor. They keep them at ease and children feel free to call him whenever required. In the lockdown, this was especially important as kids were feeling more alone and helpless. SEWA team plans one-day awareness sessions and fun activities sporadically.

HEALTH CHECK-UPS

Monthly+ Yearly health check ups are done.
Possible scenarios:

- Team calls all children to stand in a line and starts to measure height and weight. They write down the BMI of all the children in their health record. They ask everyone if they are facing any health concerns. If any medical problem is found, financial assistance is provided to get hospitalised.
- They reads out what the necessary COVID precautions are. When the children ask him questions, they answer to the best of his ability. The female members teach girls about menstrual health and distribute sanitary pads.



VISIT TUTIONS

To aid students learning and help them perform in competitive exams, AAs has enrolled SEWA children in a set of tuition classes, coaching centres and spoken english classes for free. SEWA team does frequent visits to these classes to correspond with payments.
Possible scenarios:

- Team meets tuition teacher and asks her about children's performance in studies.
- Tuition teacher suggests that a particular bright student attempt IIT entrance. Team would consult student and if he is willing, enroll him to local coaching centre.

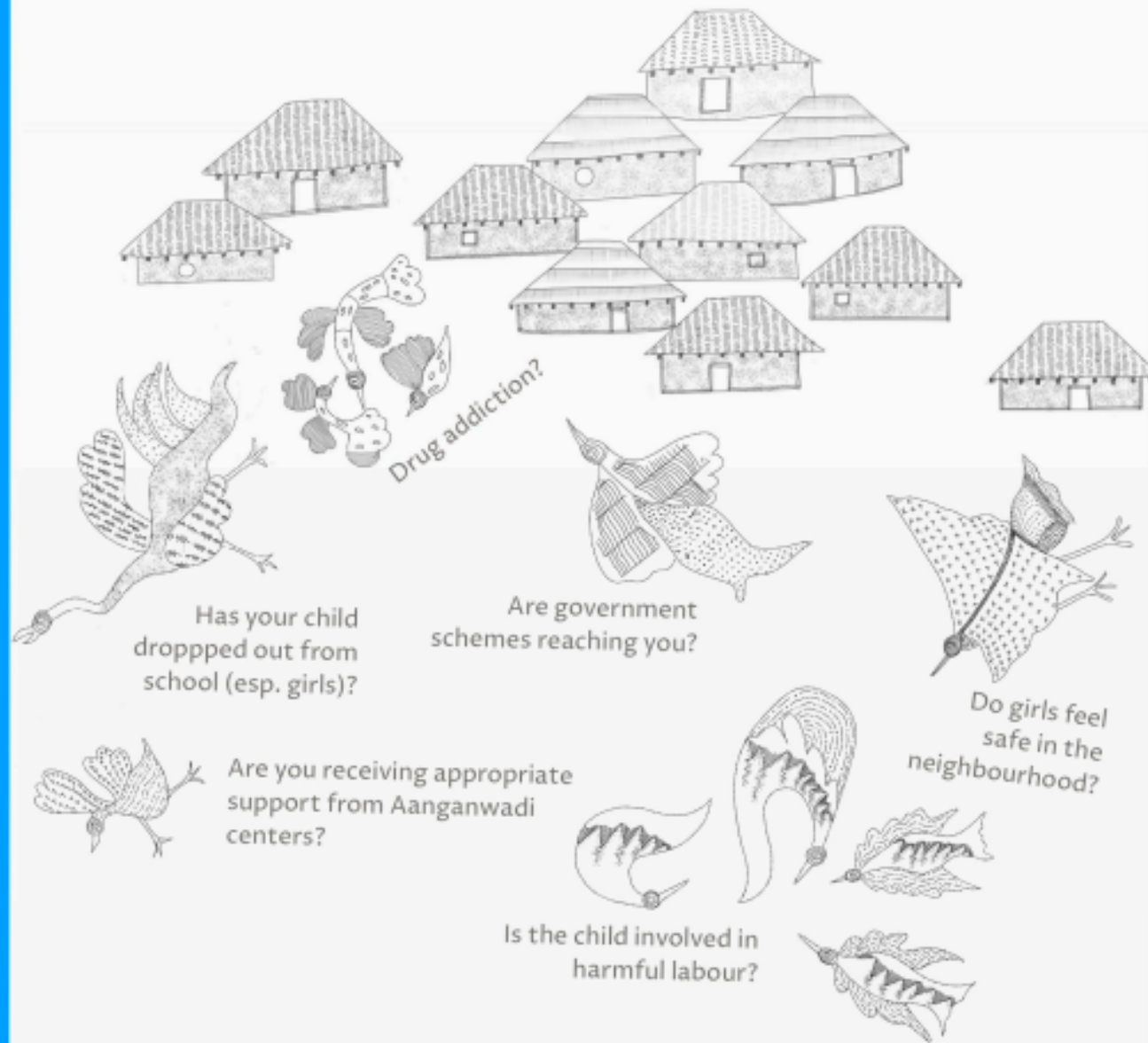


CAREER COUNSELLING

Team corresponds with a professional counsellor and discusses about each child's interests. Based on this, the counsellor conducts personality development session for all the children, with career counselling interest for 10-12th graders. (Five such sessions have been conducted.)



AAS has started its association with CRY in January 2020 for the implementation of "Surakshit Bachpan" project in Indore and Dewas district. Under this project, we work on building a child friendly environment. We are currently working on issues such as education of girl child, child protection, child marriage etc. We have started work in 15 communities, each with an average of 300 households. Following are some topics that were covered in an extensive door to door data collection.



Based on the detailed data, our team is working on a plan of action in each of the 15 communities (Scan QR code to see current plan). However, we have already started implementing some ideas as shown in the tree.

Tuition for children: A team of 10 teachers working with AAs hold daily classes for children. We have enrolled 623 children from 1st-5th standard and 891 children from 6th-12th. Our team is putting in every effort to motivate every enrolled child to attend classes regularly.



Sports & Self defence: Our team organises routine fun games and activities for children. We also partner with a martial arts instructor for self-defence classes especially for girls.



Safe space: We explain to children that this is a place where they are free to express themselves openly, and feel safe physically.



Resource Centres: We have taken 4 small houses in 4 of the communities for rent and converted them into multi-purpose rooms for children. Each can fit around 50 children and has a room with stationary and some story books that we lend to children.



Awareness on Child protection: Our team periodically conducts training on "Good Touch Bad Touch" & some other Child rights related modules.

VCPC: We have helped set up Village Child Protection committees in many of these communities. This is a government-mandated committee with important people in the community and aanganwadi workers who will be looking out for the child protection and nutrition for the children in their area.

CHILDLINE SE DOSTI WEEK

14-11-2021 - 20-11-2021

The birthday of Nehru ji brings forth the most awaited event of the year for Childline i.e. Childline se Dosti event. It started from 14-11-2021 and the team concluded the event on 20-11-2021.

The childline team commenced the event by honoring the idol of Nehru ji and invited Mr. Jeetu Patwari (M.L.A) and with his words of encouragement, team went ahead with the rest of the plans for the day. Team visited the police stations tied hand bands as a symbol of friendship, a community in Mhow (Dongargaanv) and informed the people there about the operations of Childline. Team paused for the day with celebrating the event with RJ Neetu and children of Masti ki pathshala at Childline office.

On 15/11/2021, the team met Aakash Vijayvargiya (M.L.A) and discussed with him about the helpline no. 1098 and services that Childline team provides. Team went to Palasia Women's Police station and Geeta Bhawan square, met with the Police and Traffic Police and tied the hand bands of childline. Team also visited in the community of Mangliya and addressed the children and several people and informed them about the childline.

On 16/11/2021, Team covered majority of police stations of Indore meeting all the police officers, discussed with them about the Child rights and Child Welfare. Team visited the campus of D.I.E.T and Indore School of Social Work and informed them about the functions of Childline.

On 17/11/2021, Childline team went to collector office, there a signature Campaign was organized by the team, also team met with Mr. Shankar Lalwani (Member of Lok Sabha), Officials of Integrated Child Protection Scheme (ICPS), Women and Child Development Department (WCD), Labor Department and Child Welfare Committee. Team tied the hand bands and made them sign the banner of Childline.

On 18/11/2021, Childline team organized a cycle rally with the children of Masti ki Pathshala and Students of Indore School of Social Work. Team did the cycling from Nehru Stadium to Palasia selfie point preaching about the Childline and helpline no. 1098. Team also went to Utkrasht Bal Vinay Mandir accompanied by A.S.P and S.I. Team addressed children and school staff, informed them about childline.

CHIDLIN SE DOSTI WEEK

14-11-2021 - 20-11-2021

On **19/11/2021**, team visited Shraddhanand and Armaan Shelter home, Special Juvenile Police Unit, Nayi Duniya Press Office and Crime Branch Office, Narcotics department and T.B hospital and preached about Childline and tied hand bands of friendship.

On **20/11/2021**, team met with ex Lok Sabha Speaker Smt. Sumitra Mahajan and M.L.A Mr. Mahendra Hardiya, team discussed and informed them about the Childline and its work for the children. Team also met with D.I.G, C.S.P, S.I. Team met with district coordinator of U.N.I.C.E.F Bhaarti Ma'am and also visited mental hospital of Indore.

Team put an end to the Event by Visiting M.L.A Mr. Ramesh Mendola and District Court met the advocates and preached about the Childline.



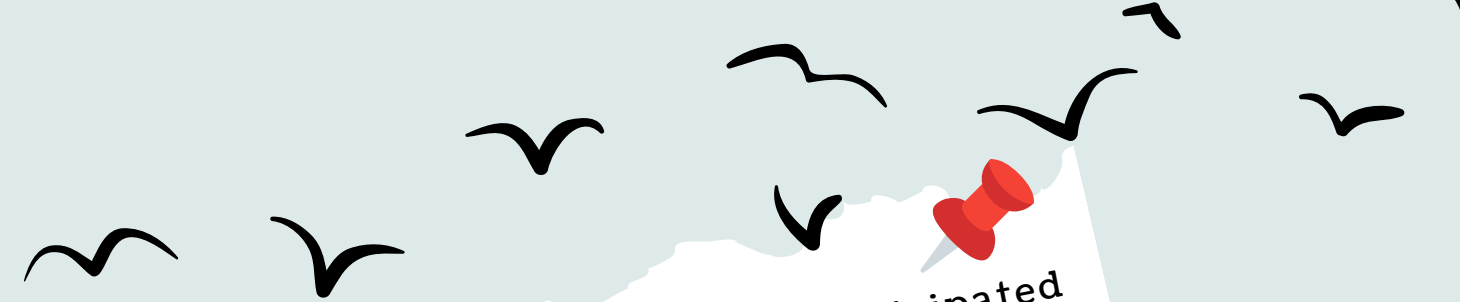
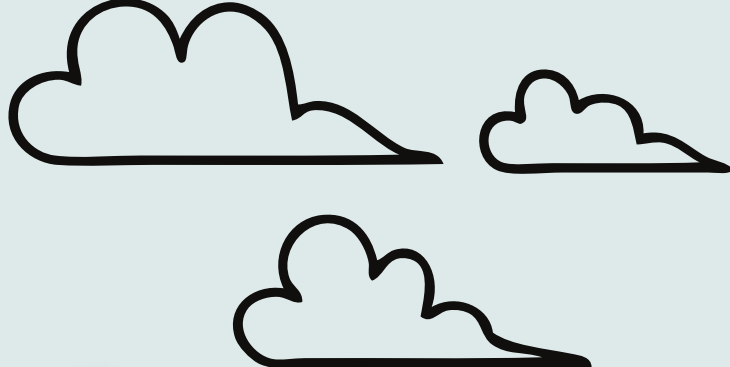
VACCINATION CAMP FOR CHILDREN BETWEEN 15-17 YEARS OF AGE ON

In view of covid, it becomes necessary to get children who live on the streets or in the slum areas also vaccinated, so that these children can be prevented from getting infected. On 18/01/2022 and on 31/01/22, the organization organised a vaccination campaign for these children under the coordination of Child Line, Women and Child Development Department, Municipal Corporation and Health Department. On 18/01/22 the campaign was carried out in Khajrana Square, Baba Ki Bagh, Jhalla Colony, Mayapuri and Mansab Nagar, under which about 90 children between the age group of 15 to 18 years were administered the first dose of the vaccine. On 31/2/22 the vaccination camp was organised in the slums of Panch Sheel Nagar, Rain Basera, Gandhi Nagar, and Bada Bangarda, under which 44 children aged 15 to 18 years were vaccinated with Covaccine. After the children got vaccinated, they took a selfie with Jethalal's selfie board. The children said that they would motivate their friends, neighbours and their parents also to get vaccinated. Biscuits and bananas were distributed for diet to the children who got vaccinated.

REGULAR FREE CLASSES FOR COMMUNITY CHILDREN UNDER FIS PROJECT

Regular classes for the community children have been undergoing since 1 February, 2022 for class-6th to 12th. The classes have been attended by 2000 children from all 10 communities. They are taught all subjects and creative activities are also undertaken. These children belong to underserved communities and almost all children have suffered from academic gap due to Covid-19.





450 Girls from the community participated in the self-defense training programme. They gained confidence to go to the school alone.



Children group were formed in the communities. Wash Protocol sessions, awareness sessions on Child Rights, Child Labor, Child Marriage, Menstrual Hygiene etc. were conducted.

66 group meetings organized. Approx. 632 children participated in meetings.



Children's groups were formed and 20 sessions in 15 communities on Psycho-Social wellbeing were conducted. Activities like Line activity, Name Story, cap making, and puppet making were conducted. Team in collaboration with an organisation holds mental health sessions twice a week for children. Around 30 children participate enthusiastically in these sessions. They also take sessions with parents to address various parenting issues.

Life Skill sessions were organized in the intervention areas. 41 sessions with 510 children.

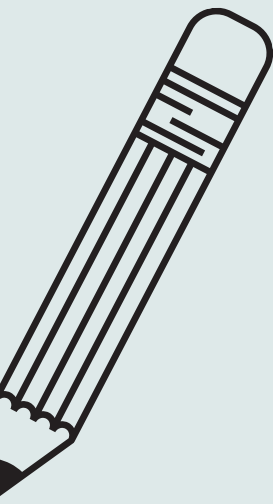

STAFF WELFARE ACTIVITIES

Having a conversation on mental health has become more important than ever. Specially, as the aftermath of Pandemic, we all have become more concerned about our mental well-being. Mental well-being doesn't only help us to deal with ups and downs of our everyday life, but also improves the quality of our life.

Striving to fulfil the vision of creating a child-friendly world, we cannot work in a vacuum. We work with individuals coming from various walks of life and communities having diverse belief systems. To work effectively, we must understand the psychology of the community we are dealing with. Community psychology goes beyond an individual focus and integrates social, cultural, economic, political, environmental, and international influences to promote positive change, health, and empowerment at individual and systemic levels. To address the issue, AAS, Indore in collaboration with Aatma Prakash Foundation, Indore organized a 3-day training Programme on community Psychology and Well-being.

3-DAY TRAINING SESSION ON 'COMMUNITY AND WELLBEING' AND PSYCHOLOGY

EXPOSURE VISIT TO SYNERGY SANSTHAN, HARDA (M.P.)



Host Organisation- Synergy Sansthan, Harda

Theme of Training- Child protection practices and alternative care models.

Total Staff Members Trained- 24

The overall objective of the exposure visit was to exchange ideas and experiences regarding child protection practices and alternative care model adopted by the organisation Synergy Sansthan. The training session also included discussion on challenges faced while working with youth and adolescents. The visit also involved interaction with the Udaan fellowship alumnus, current interns and other staff members for sharing of experiences and change stories.



EXPOSURE VISIT AT SOS CHILDREN'S HOME, BHOPAL

Venue- SOS Children's home, Bhopal

The theme of Training- Orphans care models.

Total Staff Members Trained- 22

The overall objective of the exposure visit was to know about their workings and learn about the shelter home management, and orphan care models adopted by the organization SOS Children's home. The training session also included a discussion on challenges faced while working with orphans. The visit also involved interaction with the staff members.

TWO DAYS TRAINING PROGRAMME ON 'THE THEORY OF CHANGE'

The session began with the introduction round and a warm-up activity was done with all the participants. The participants were asked to pick a number and later they all changed their places. The activity taught that it was easier to distinguish everybody's number when they were seated according to the number picked.

The participants were asked about their understanding of The Theory of change. The resource person went on to explain the importance and ways of the application of the theory through the PowerPoint presentation. The presentation included a detailed discussion on LFA (Logical Framework Analysis), SWOT Analysis, Timeline making, and Gantt Chart.

On the second day, the project coordinators shared their projects, achievements, intervention data, challenges faced, and upcoming plans through the presentation. Everyone exchanged their ideas, and solutions to overcome challenges.
